Keeping children and young people safe and promoting their happiness and wellbeing is a shared responsibility for all of us: teachers, governors, support staff, parents, carers and visitors of all kinds.

What to do if you're worried about a child

Worries come in all shapes and sizes from those gut feelings we sometimes have through seeing something that troubles us to children telling us they are at risk. Some risks are very serious some less so but they all need to be reliably shared to keep our young people safe: the question is how to do that?

In school as a team we meet twice a day every day before the school day starts and when it ends and we always ask the question "are there any worries or concerns about the children's welfare and safety? It is what happens next that is important for everybody to know.

The school team uses an electronic system called CPOMS to log and record things in writing but what about everybody else?

Mr Jones the headteacher is the school's lead on safeguarding and he works with and supported by Carl Moore our deputy safeguarding lead: these are the people to ask for or to contact over any worry or concern: and please don't hesitate to do so.
